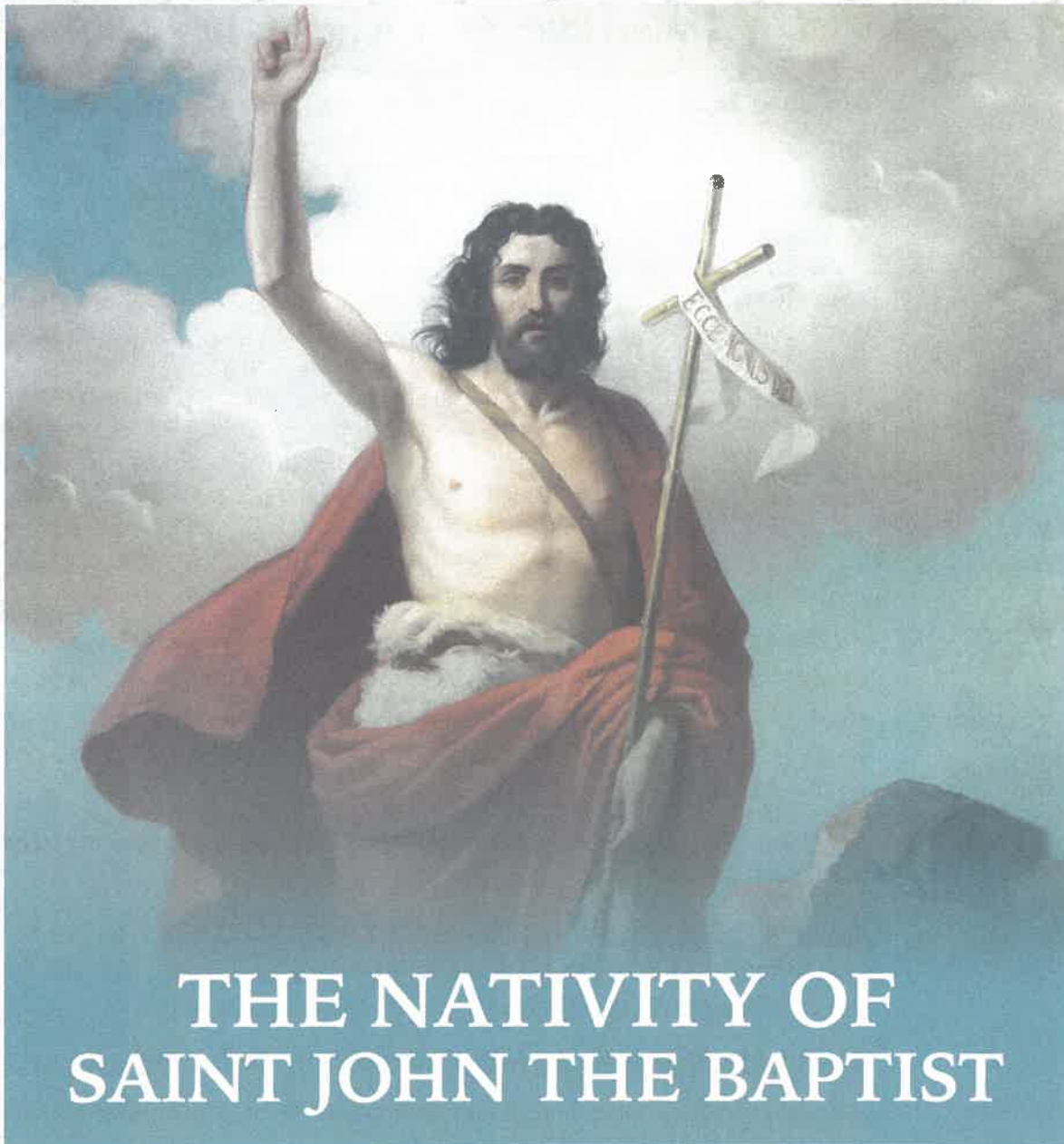

They desired for us to become kind, selfless and faith-filled individuals.

St. John the Baptist grew up to do great things because the hand of the Lord was with him indeed. The Lord's hand is at work in the lives of every child we see here at Mass today. The child next to you might become the teacher that you needed as a child. The boy in the front row may become a priest. The little girl in the cry room might be the one to discover a cure for cancer.

As we celebrate St. John the Baptist today, take a moment to remember that the children around us are born to do wonderful things as a part of God's wonderful plan for this life.

Telling the Truth like John the Baptist

John the Baptist preached the truth boldly, without sugar-coating it. In a Culture of Death, we must do the same.

In "The Gospel of Life," Pope John Paul II put it this way:

"The acceptance of abortion in the popular mind, in behavior and even in law itself, is a telling sign of an extremely dangerous crisis of the moral sense, which is becoming more and more incapable of distinguishing between good and evil, even when the fundamental right to life is at stake".

Given such a grave situation, we need now more than ever to have the courage to look the truth in the eye and to call things by their proper name, without yielding to convenient compromises or to the temptation of self-deception. In this regard the reproach of the Prophet is extremely straightforward: "Woe to those who call evil good and good evil, who put darkness for light and light for darkness" (Is 5:20).

Especially in the case of abortion there is a widespread use of ambiguous terminology, such as "interruption of pregnancy", which tends to hide abortion's true nature and to attenuate its seriousness in public opinion. Perhaps this linguistic phenomenon is itself a symptom of an uneasiness of conscience. But no word has the power to change the reality of things: procured abortion is the deliberate and direct killing, by whatever means it is carried out, of a human being in the initial phase of his or her existence, extending from conception to birth" (EV n. 58).

Mass with Prayers for Healing

A Mass with prayers for healing is being held Monday, July 30th at 6:00 pm at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Rosary, 2801 E. 4th St., Duluth. Adoration will be available from 11 am—4 pm that day with confessions offered from 1—3:00 pm and after the 6:00 pm Mass. Priests and deacons will be available to pray with individuals following the Mass for all who desire it.

At this Mass we are begging God to heal people according to His will. The center point of this celebration is the Mass (we have to remember that all Masses are healing and that God in any Mass can heal people). What is different about this Mass is that we are intentionally praying for people who are suffering physically, psychologically, and spiritually. We are asking God to heal the wounded.

At the end of the Mass, we have a Eucharistic Procession with Jesus in the Monstrance. He travels through the church blessing people like when He walked through Galilee and Jerusalem. Our God comes into our midst to heal. When the Procession is completed with Benediction (a blessing from Jesus with the Monstrance), the priests are available to pray over people individually. There will be priests available in the confessionals to hear confessions as well.

Many people have been healed over the years. Some go to confession and that is the healing the Lord wants to give them. Others go to the priests for individual prayers and are healed physically. One man who was Lactose intolerant was healed. A Sister had her hearing restored. God works through His priests to bring the healing that He desires. We never know how the Lord is going to work on this night, but it is always beautiful!

Come and pray for healing! Maybe you don't think you need to be healed and yet are feeling a call to attend to intercede for those who will be there that night. What a great gift our Lord gives us! Invite friends and come. Everyone is invited, Adults. Children. Catholics. Non-catholics. YOU!
